Chemistry profile and complete blood count (CBC) A blood chemistry profile, including SDMA, provides information about your cat's kidneys, liver, and pancreas, as well as other functions of the body, such as blood sugar and hydration. Complete urinalysis This analysis assesses the overall health of your cat's urinary tract, including the kidneys and bladder. Infectious disease screening This screening indicates whether your cat has been infected with feline leukemia virus (FeLV) and feline immunodeficiency virus (FIV)—the most common infectious diseases in cats. It also indicates exposure to heartworm. This test should be performed at least once for indoor cats and yearly for cats who venture outside. Intestinal Parasite Test This test checks for intestinal parasites that may live in your cat's gastrointestinal tract.
